"The Reconstruction Competitions were described as the 'main difficulty' facing the Civil Service Commission, and they are nearly over. After 1949, recruitment to the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service will fall to an average of 48 per annum and that to the Senior Branch of the Foreign Service to 30 per annum. Thus, the future intake of the types of candidate which involve the Commission in the most detailed work will soon reach its pre-war level, though admittedly the methods of examination involved are more complicated. Recruitment of the Scientific Civil Service requires a staff of 55. It is difficult to see how the other additional tasks of the Civil Service Commission necessitate such a large increase in staff and such a high proportion of staff engaged on routine tasks. It was stated in evidence that the work of the Commission before the war 'was very largely a routine job, and now it is nothing of the sort. Almost every letter . . . raises a question which has to be dealt with by someone who is competent to exercise

judgment'. Your Committee are not satisfied either that the Civil Service Commission are reducing the numbers of their staff as quickly as they could or that the total staff cannot be brought below the figure of 500. Accordingly, they recommend that the Commission should take immediate steps to review the numbers they employ, particularly in the lower grades, with the aim of making substantial reductions.'

#### Paragraph 16 read as follows: --

"Amidst much conflicting opinion, Your Committee have reached their conclusion mainly on a study made by Members of the tests employed by the Selection Board and their observation of the candidates undergoing them. There is no doubt that it is of great importance to recruit only the best men and women to the Administrative Services of the Crown, and that it is essential to provide a sum adequate to ensure that such recruits are in fact appointed. Your Committee, however, consider that, though some of the tests used by the Board are most valuable, the system as a whole tends to favour candidates who are quick at dealing with intelligence tests, but who may lack some of the qualities especially valuable to the Government service. Moreover, they consider that the Manor House at Stoke D'Abernon provides an unnecessarily elaborate background and that equally beneficial results could be attained at a centre less costly in maintenance and staff. At Stoke D'Abernon, at the present time, the maximum number of directing staff and candidates present at any one time can only be 33. To look after them there is a domestic staff of 22. Your Committee therefore recommend that, when the present lease of the house at Stoke D'Abernon comes to an end, smaller and less expensive premises should be found. Furthermore, in view of the fact that the number of candidates is likely to be considerably reduced in the near future, Your Committee also recommend that there should be a corresponding reduction in the directing staff."

Amendment proposed in line 10, to leave out from the word "service" to the end of the paragraph, and add the words:—

"Evidence taken both in a previous Session and in this, reinforced by personal experience of members of Your Committee, is overwhelming, that with few exceptions the introvert and not the extrovert personality presents himself and is successful. Your Committee consider this to be a fault which must be ascribed rather to the general attitude of the Commission and the method of selection of candidates than to the Board. Nevertheless, it can be said that the Board's methods in no way mitigate what appears to be an undesirable tendency, especially in candidates for the Foreign Service. On this, Your Committee join with the First Commissioner in regretting that the Foreign Office have insisted on 100 per cent. of their candidates passing through Stoke D'Abernon. As stated above, the Colonial Office, whose requirements seem to differ less from the Foreign Office than do those of the Foreign Office from the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service, do not have recourse to the Selection Board but prefer their own tried method of interviews with candidates and close correspondence with their instructors, relatives and friends. Your Committee consider that the Foreign Office would do well to open the field to candidates from sources other than Method II, following as far as may be appropriate the procedure adopted by

the Colonial Office. Your Committee realise that the annual programme before the Selection Board would, if this decision were taken, decline to something below the four to six months foreshadowed, at which rate its continuing existence would be indefensible. Your Committee have no fear that in bringing to an end the work of the Board the valuable lessons learned in this interesting experiment will be lost to the nation. There are fields in industry and commerce where the methods devised here might conveniently apply. But the paramount consideration is need for economy in the public service where value for money is not fully obtainable. For this and the foregoing reasons Your Committee recommend that the work of the Board should be terminated before the end of the financial year."—(Viscount Hinchingbrooke.)
