Conversion Loan provided that if the average daily price as certified by the Bank of England during a half-year ending 1st April or 1st October has been below 90, Sinking Fund is to be issued to an amount of not less than 1 per cent. of the Loan outstanding at the said 1st April or 1st October, such Sinking Fund to be applied during the succeeding half-year to purchase of the Loan for cancellation. The average price for the half-years ended 1st April, 1936 and 1st October, 1936 being above 90, no issues of Sinking Fund were made during the year 1936-37 (11 & 12 Geo. V. c. 32).

V.—4 PER CENT. CONSOLIDATED LOAN SINKING FUND.

The prospectus of the 4 per cent. Consolidated Loan provided for a Sinking Fund at the rate of £2,500,000 a quarter to be applied until 30th April, 1937, so long as the price of the Loan is at or below par. During the year 1936-37 the price remained above par and accordingly no issues of the Sinking Fund were made (18 & 19 Geo. V. c. 17).
