## ECOWAS PARLIAMENT HOLDS EXTRAORDINARY SESSION





The ECOWAS Parliament has on Monday, 2 February, convened in Abuja for an extraordinary session. The objective of the session, according to the Speaker and Chairman of the National Institute for Legislative Studies Governing Council, Sen. Ike Ekweremadu, was mainly to formally brief the Community as well as make presentation of the Supplementary Act relating to the enhancement of the Powers of the ECOWAS Parliament.
