AN ACT TO REPEAL THE POLICE SERVICE COMMISSION (ESTABLISHMENT) ACT, 2001 AND TO ENACT THE POLICE SERVICE COMMISSION (REFORM) ACT 2020, TO MAKE FURTHER PROVISIONS FOR THE COMPOSITION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE POLICE SERVICE COMMISSION; ITS FUNCTIONS AND POWERS; AND FOR RELATED MATTERS

ENACTED by the National Assembly of the Federal Republic of Nigeria as follows:

1 PART I - ESTABLISHMENT, ETC., OF THE POLICE SERVICE COMMISSION

2 1.-(1) There is hereby established a body to be known as the Police
3 Service Commission (in this Act referred to as "the Commission").

Establishment

4 (2) The Commission:

5 (a) is a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common
6 seal; and

7 (b) shall sue or be sued in its corporate name.

8 (3) The headquarters of the Commission shall be at the Federal
9 Capital Territory, Abuja.

10 2.-(1) The Commission shall comprise a Chairman, who shall be
11 the Chief Executive Officer, and eight (8) members, appointed in line with
12 the principles of Federal Character and in accordance with Section 156 of
13 the Constitution, with the following qualifications:

Membership of
the Commission

14 (a) The Chairman shall be a person who is:

15 (i) not more than the age of 55 at the time of the appointment; and

16 (ii) not a card-carrying member of any political party at the time of
17 his appointment or for the five (5) years preceding the appointment;

18 (b) A woman who has experience working in the area of sexual

- 1 harassment and gender-based violence;
- 2 (c) A youth, being a person who is:
- 3 (i) not more than thirty-five (35) years of age at the time of
- 4 appointment; and
- 5 (ii) a member in good standing of a recognized profession.
- 6 (d) A retired Police Officer not below the rank of Commissioner of
- 7 Police;
- 8 (e) A retired Justice of either the Court of Appeal or Supreme Court of
- 9 Nigeria; and
- 10 (f) A representative each of:
- 11 (i) National Human Rights Commission;
- 12 (ii) Nigerian Bar Association;
- 13 (iii) Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences
- 14 Commission; and
- 15 (iv) Civil Society Organisations.
- 16 (2) The Management of the Commission shall vest in the Chairman
- 17 and members of the Commission.
- 18 **3.-(1)** The Chairman and other members of the Commission shall:
- 19 (a) be appointed by the President subject to confirmation by the
- 20 Senate;
- 21 (b) be persons of Integrity and ability.
- 22 (2) A member of the Commission shall each hold office for a single
- 23 term of five (5) years and no more.
- 24 (3) Members of the Commission shall be paid; salaries and
- 25 allowances as prescribed by the Revenue Mobilization Allocation and Fiscal
- 26 Commission.
- 27 (4) The supplementary provisions set out in the Schedule to this Act
- 28 shall have effect with respect to the proceedings of the Commission and the
- 29 other matters contained.

Schedule

1 **4.-(1)** A member of the Commission shall cease to hold office if the
2 person:
3 (a) has been declared bankrupt;
4 (b) resigns by notice in writing to the President;
5 (c) is convicted of a felony or any offence involving dishonesty of
6 fraud; or
7 (d) becomes of unsound mind, or is incapable of carrying out their
8 duties; or
9 (e) is guilty of serious misconduct in relation to his duties; or
10 (f) in the case of a member who during his tenure is a person who
11 possessed professional qualifications, is disqualified or suspended other
12 than at his own request from practicing his profession in any part of the
13 world by an order of a competent authority made in respect of that member.

14 (2) A member of the Commission may be removed by the
15 President, in accordance with the provisions of Section 157 of the
16 Constitution if he is satisfied that it is not in the interest of the Commission or
17 the interest of the public that the member should continue in Office.

18 (3) Where a vacancy occurs in the membership of the Commission,
19 the President shall appoint a replacement within 6 (six) months

20 **5.** A member may resign his appointment by a notice in writing
21 under his hand addressed to the President and that member shall on the date
22 of the receipt of the notice by the President cease to be a member of the
23 Commission.

24 PART II - FUNCTIONS AND POWERS OF THE COMMISSION

25 **6.-(1)** The Commission shall:

Functions of the
Commission

26 (a) be responsible for the appointment and promotion of persons to
27 offices (other than the office of the Inspector-General of Police) in the
28 Nigeria Police Force;

29 (b) dismiss and exercise disciplinary control over persons (other
30 than the Inspector-General of Police) in the Nigeria Police Force;

1 (c) formulate policies and guidelines for the appointment, promotion,
2 discipline, and dismissal of officers of the Nigeria Police Force with the
3 exception of the Inspector General of Police;

4 (d) formulate, publish, and implement policies aimed at the
5 efficiency and discipline of the Nigeria Police Force;

6 (e) develop guidelines and procedures for investigating allegations
7 and complaints of misconduct against police officers;

8 (f) employ, train, designate and deploy persons to serve as
9 Investigators in all the State Offices of the Commission;

10 (g) shall from time to time review, the terms of reference and
11 operational guidelines of any tactical units set up by the Inspector General of
12 Police;

13 (h) shall review and update of the curriculum for training officers of
14 the Nigeria Police Force every three years;

15 (i) investigate reports of misconduct by officers of the Nigeria Police
16 Force and impose disciplinary measures;

17 (j) do such other things as are necessary and expedient for the efficient
18 performance of the functions of the Commission.

19 (2) Where after investigation of a case of misconduct under section
20 6(1)(i) the Commission concludes that an offence might have been committed,
21 the Commission shall refer the case to the Attorney General of the Federation,
22 the Attorney General of the State or any other body with powers to prosecute
23 the offence.

24 (3) The Commission's power to impose disciplinary measures where
25 a misconduct is established is unaffected by the fact that it has referred a case
26 for prosecution.

27 (4) The Commission shall not be subject to the direction, control or
28 supervision of any other authority or person in performance of its functions
29 other than as prescribed in this Act.

- 1 7. The Commission shall have power to: Power of the
Commission
- 2 (a) pay the staff of the Commission such remuneration and
- 3 allowances as approved by the President on the recommendation of the
- 4 National Salaries, Incomes and Wages Commission;
- 5 (b) enter into such contracts as may be necessary or expedient for
- 6 the discharge of its functions and ensure the efficient performance of the
- 7 functions of the Commission;
- 8 (c) establish Investigation Units in each of its State Offices and the
- 9 Federal Capital Territory (FCT) to investigate allegations of misconduct
- 10 made against police officers;
- 11 (d) do such other things as are necessary and expedient for the
- 12 efficient performance of the functions of the Commission.
- 13 8. The Commission may, subject to such conditions as it may think Powers of the
Delegation
- 14 fit, delegate any of its powers under this Act:
- 15 (a) to any officer in the service of the Nigeria Police Force; or
- 16 (b) to a Committee constituted by the Commission.
- 17 PART III - STRUCTURE OF THE COMMISSION
- 18 9.-(1) There shall be established in the headquarters of the Establishment
of Departments
- 19 Commission the following Departments:
- 20 (a) Office of the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer;
- 21 (b) Office of the Secretary to the Commission;
- 22 (c) Department of Administration and Finance;
- 23 (d) Department of Investigation;
- 24 (e) Department of Information and Communications Technology;
- 25 (f) the Department of Training, Research and Development;
- 26 (g) the Department of Legal Services; and
- 27 (h) any other Department as the Commission determines
- 28 (2) The Commission shall establish State Offices in each State of
- 29 the Federation and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) for the efficient
- 30 discharge of its functions.

1 PART IV - STAFF OF THE COMMISSION

Appointment of
Secretary to the
Commission

2 **10.**-(1) There shall be, a Secretary to the Commission who shall:
3 (a) be appointed by the Commission to a single term of seven (7)
4 years;
5 (b) be a legal Practitioner with a minimum of ten (10) post call with
6 experience in management and administration;
7 (c) keep the books and proper records of the proceedings of the
8 Commission;
9 (d) coordinate the activities of all departments and report to the
10 Chairman; and
11 (e) be entitled to such remuneration and allowances as are approved
12 by the President on the recommendation of the National Salaries, Incomes and
13 Wages Commission.

14 (2) The Commission shall have power to:

15 (a) employ either directly or on secondment from any civil or public
16 service in the Federation or a State such number of employees as may, in the
17 opinion of the Commission, be required to assist the Commission in the
18 discharge of any of its functions under this Act;
19 (b) pay to persons so employed such remuneration (including
20 allowances) as are approved by the President on the recommendation of the
21 National Salaries, Incomes and Wages Commission; and
22 (c) pay to persons employed as Consultants and members of
23 Committees such remunerations as are approved by the Commission.

Service in the

be pensionable

24 **11.**-(1) Service in the Commission shall be approved service for the
25 purposes of the Pension Reform Act 2014.

26 (2) The commission may employ such other persons who by their
27 terms of appointment excludes such person from earning pension.

28 PART V - FINANCIAL PROVISIONS.

Funds of the
Commission

29 **12.**-(1) The Commission shall establish and maintain a fund from
30 which shall be defrayed all expenditure incurred by the Commission.

1 (2) There shall be paid and credited to the fund established
2 pursuant to Subsection (1) of this section:

3 (a) such monies as may, from time to time, be granted or lent to or
4 deposited with the Commission by the Federal or State Government or any
5 other body or institution whether local or foreign;

6 (b) all monies raised for the purposes of the Commission by way of
7 gifts, loan, grants-in-aid, testamentary dispositions or otherwise; and

8 (c) proceeds from all other assets that may, from time to time,
9 accrue to the Commission.

10 (3) The fund shall be managed in accordance with the rules made
11 by the Commission, and without prejudice to the generality of the power to
12 make rules under this subsection, the rules shall in particular contain
13 provisions:

14 (a) specifying the manner in which the assets or the fund of the
15 Commission are to be held, and regulating the making of payments into and
16 out of the Fund; and

17 (b) requiring the keeping of proper accounts and records for the
18 purpose of the Fund in such form as may be specified in the rules.

19 **13.** The Commission shall apply the proceeds of the Fund
20 established pursuant to Section 12 of this Act to:

21 (a) the cost of administration of the Commission;

22 (b) the payment of salaries, allowances and benefits of members of
23 the Commission or any Committee of the Commission;

24 (c) the payment of salaries, remuneration, allowances, benefits,
25 pensions and gratuities payable to officers and employees of the
26 Commission;

27 (d) the payment for all contracts, including mobilization,
28 fluctuations, variations, legal fees and cost of contract administration;

29 (e) the payment for all purchases; and

30 (f) undertake such other activities as are connected with all or any

	1	of the functions of the Commission under this Act.
Gifts to the Commission	2	14. -(1) The Commission may accept gifts of land, money or other
	3	property on such terms and conditions, if any, as may be specified by the person
	4	or organization making the gift.
	5	(2) The Commission shall not accept any gift if the conditions
	6	attached thereto are inconsistent with the functions or in conflict with the
	7	mandate of the Commission under this Act.
Annual Estimates and Expenditure	8	15. -(1) The Commission shall, not later than 30th September in each
	9	year, submit to the President an estimate of the expenditure and income of the
	10	Commission during the next succeeding year.
	11	(2) The Commission shall cause to be kept proper accounts of the
	12	Commission in respect of each year and shall cause the accounts to be audited
	13	not later than 6 months after the end of each year by auditors appointed from the
	14	list and in accordance with the guidelines supplied by the Auditor-General for
	15	the Federation.
Bi-Annual report	16	16. The Commission shall, at the end of every six (6) months, submit
	17	to the National Assembly, the National Police Council, the National Human
	18	Rights Commission, the Nigerian Bar Association and Honourable Attorney
	19	General of the federation, a report on the status and disposition of disciplinary
	20	matters that the Commission is considering or has considered within the
	21	reporting period.
Annual Report	22	17. -(1) The Commission shall prepare and submit to the President,
	23	not later than 30th June in each year, a report in such form as the President may
	24	direct on the activities of the Commission during the immediately preceding
	25	year, and shall include in the report a copy of the audited accounts of the
	26	Commission for that year and the auditor's report thereon.
	27	(2) The President, upon receipt of the report referred to in subsection
	28	(1) of this section, cause a copy of the report and the audited accounts of the
	29	Commission and the auditor's report thereon to be submitted to each House of
	30	the National Assembly.

1 PART VI - MISCELLANEOUS

2 18.-(1) For the purposes of providing offices and premises Offices and
3 necessary for the performance of its functions under this Act, the Premises of the
4 Commission may, subject to the Land Use Act: Commission

5 (a) purchase or take on lease any interest in land, or other property;
6 and

7 (b) construct offices and premises and equip and maintain same.

8 (2) The Commission may, subject to the Land Use Act, sell or lease
9 out any office or premises held by it, which office or premises is no longer
10 required for the performance of its functions under this Act.

11 19.-(1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the provisions of the Limitation of
12 Public Officers Protection Act shall apply in relation to any suit instituted suits against the
13 against any officer or employee of the Commission. Commission

14 (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law or
15 enactment, no suit shall lie against any member of the Commission, the
16 Secretary or any other officer or employee of the Commission for any act
17 done in pursuance or execution of this Act or any other law or enactment, or
18 of any public duty or authority or in respect of any alleged neglect or default
19 in the execution of this Act or such law or enactment, duty or authority, shall
20 lie or be instituted in any Court unless:

21 (a) it is commenced within three months next after the Act, neglect
22 or default complained of; or

23 (b) in the case of a continuation of damage or injury, within six
24 months next after the ceasing thereof.

25 (3) No suit shall be commenced against a member of the
26 Commission, the Secretary, officer or employee of the Commission before
27 the expiration of a period of one month after written notice of intention to
28 commence the suit shall have been served upon the Commission by the
29 intending plaintiff or his agent.

30 (4) The notice referred to in Subsection(3) of this section shall

	1	clearly and explicitly state the cause of action, the particulars of the claim, the
	2	name and place of abode of the intending plaintiff and the relief, which he
	3	claims.
Service of Documents	4	20. A notice, summons or other document required or authorized to
	5	be served upon the Commission under the provisions of this Act or any other
	6	law or enactment may be served by delivering it to the Secretary or by sending
	7	it by registered post and addressed to the Secretary at the headquarters of the
	8	Commission.
Transitional Provision	9	21. Officers in the Nigeria Police Force shall on the commencement
	10	of this Act, continue in office and be deemed to have been appointed to his
	11	office by the Commission under this Act.
Regulations	12	22. The Commission may make regulations generally for the
	13	purposes of giving full effect to this Act.
Miscellaneous	14	23. -(1) The fixing of the seal of the Commission shall be
	15	authenticated by the signatures of the Chairman or any other member of the
	16	Commission generally or specifically authorized by the Commission to act for
	17	that purpose and the Secretary.
	18	(2) Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a person
	19	not being a body corporate, would not be required to be under seal may be made
	20	or executed on behalf of the Commission by the Secretary or any person
	21	generally or specifically authorized by the Commission to act for that purpose.
	22	(3) A document purporting to be duly executed under the seal of the
	23	Commission shall be received in evidence and shall, unless and until the
	24	contrary is proved, be presumed to be so executed.
Interpretation	25	24. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires:
	26	"Police Officer" means a member of the Nigeria Police Force to whom this Act
	27	applies;
	28	"Commission" means the Police Service Commission;
	29	"State Coordinator" means the Officer in charge of a State Office of the
	30	Commission;

1 "Member" means a member of the Police Service Commission and includes
2 the Chairman;

3 "Chairman" means the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Police
4 Service Commission;

5 "Secretary" means Secretary to the Commission appointed pursuant to
6 Section 10 of this Act;

7 "President" means the President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces
8 of the Federal Republic of Nigeria;

9 "Constitution" means the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria
10 1999 (No. 24 of 1999).

11 **25.** This Bill repeals the Police Service Commission Repeal
12 (Establishment, etc.) Act, 2001.

13 **26.** This Bill may be cited as the Police Service Commission Short title
14 (Reform) Bill, 2024.

1 SCHEDULE I

2 *Section 3(4)*3 *Proceedings of The Commission*4 1.-(1) Subject to this Act and Section 27 of the Interpretation Act, the
5 Commission may make standing orders regulating its proceedings or those of
6 any of its Committees.7 (2) The quorum of the Commission shall be the Chairman or the
8 person presiding at the meeting and 4 other members of the Commission and
9 the quorum of any Committee of the Commission shall be as determined by the
10 Commission.11 2.-(1) The Commission shall meet whenever it is summoned by the
12 Chairman and if the Chairman is required to do so by notice given to him by not
13 less than 4 other Members, he shall summon a meeting of the Commission to be
14 held within five (5) days from the date on which the notice is given.15 (2) At any meeting of the Commission, the Chairman shall preside but
16 if he is absent, the members present at the meeting shall appoint one of their
17 number to preside at the meeting.18 (3) When the Commission desires to obtain the advice of any person
19 on a particular matter, the Commission may co-opt him to the Commission for
20 such period as it deems fit, but a person who is in attendance by virtue of this
21 sub-paragraph shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Commission
22 and shall not count towards a quorum.23 (4) A decision of a State Office, an Investigator, Monitor or
24 Committee appointed by the Commission shall be of no effect until it is
25 confirmed by the Commission.26 3. The validity of any proceedings of the Commission or of a
27 Committee shall not be adversely affected by:

28 (a) a vacancy in the membership of the Commission or Committee; or

29 (b) a defect in the appointment of a member of the Commission or
30 Committee; or

1 (c) reason that a person not entitled to do so proceedings of the
2 Commission or Committee.

3 SCHEDULE II

4 *Section 6(1)*

5 *Recruitment Regulations*

6 1-(1) The Commission shall provide regulations from time to time,
7 stipulating the procedure for recruitment of recruit constables into the
8 Nigeria Police Force and recruit cadets into the Nigerian Police Academy.

9 (2) The Commission shall ensure that those regulations stipulate
10 the following minimum qualifications for recruit constables into the Nigeria
11 Police Force and recruit cadets into the Nigerian Police Academy:

12 (a) an Ordinary National Diploma (OND);

13 (b) Nigerian citizen with no records of criminal conviction;

14 (c) Have met medical standard entry requirements (including
15 psychological and mental health requirements).

16 2. The Commission shall also ensure that the recruitment of recruit
17 constables into the Nigeria Police Force and recruit cadets into the Nigeria
18 Police Academy is in accordance with the provisions on national spread and
19 Federal Character in the Constitution.

20 3. The Commission shall regularly assess the remuneration for
21 officers of the Nigeria Police Force, and where a review is required, shall
22 make recommendations for review to the National Police Council.

23 SCHEDULE III

24 *Section 6(1)(i) and Section 7(c)*

25 COMPLAINTS AGAINST POLICE OFFICERS

26 (1) A person may make a complaint of professional misconduct
27 against any member of the Nigeria Police Force to whom this Act applies:

28 (a) To the nearest state office of the Commission, from where the
29 incident took place;

30 (b) Any designated office of the Commission.

1 (2) The complaint may be made orally, in writing, or by any electronic
2 means and shall contain any of the following information as far as practicable:

- 3 (i) The nature and particulars of the misconduct;
4 (ii) The name of the police officer involved;
5 (iii) The force number of the officer involved;
6 (iv) Date and time estimates of when the incident took place;
7 (v) Any other relevant information to aid easy identification of the
8 officer involved.

9 (3) Where a complaint is made orally, an officer of the commission
10 shall reduce it into writing in the presence of the complainant, following which
11 the complainant shall sign the complaint, endorsing the date and time it was
12 made and received.

13 (4) Where a complaint has been made to the Commission in
14 compliance with Schedule 6 (III), the State Coordinator in the State where the
15 alleged misconduct occurred shall take:

- 16 (a) immediate steps to identify the officer(s) against whom the
17 complaint has been made; and
18 (b) necessary steps to confirm the basic facts supplied by the
19 complainant.

20 (5) Based on the complaint and any supporting facts, the State
21 Coordinator shall decide whether to proceed with an investigation.

22 2. Where a complaint against a police officer is laid before the Police
23 Complaints Response Unit at a Police Station or Division, the Desk Officer
24 who takes the complaint shall immediately provide a report of the complaint,
25 including all witness statements to the nearest State Office of the Police Service
26 Commission from where the incident took place.

27 3. Where the State Office determines that the facts of the complaint
28 are sufficient to warrant an investigation, the State Coordinator shall inform the
29 Commanding Officer of the division or command of the Nigeria Police Force
30 where the officer is attached, or any other Senior Officer who exercises

1 command authority over the officer involved, and direct as follows:

2 (i) to withdraw and account for the arms and ammunition assigned
3 to the officer involved;

4 (ii) post such officer to administrative duties, pending the
5 conclusion of investigation or determination of the complaint; and

6 (iii) where the complaint involves assault occasioning bodily harm
7 or injury, withdraw the officer from routine patrols and other duties that
8 involves daily interface with members of the public.

9 4. The investigative proceedings of the Commission shall be
10 evidence - based with fair hearing accorded to all the parties.

11 Accordingly, the Commission shall during investigations:

12 (i) Take witness statements;

13 (ii) Interview police officers and other members of police staff, or
14 any person interested in the complaint;

15 (iii) Analyse footage from closed-circuit television (CCTV)
16 cameras, video evidence from witnesses, body cameras worn or carried by
17 police officers where available, or any electronic evidence presented or
18 discovered in the course of the investigation;

19 (iv) Obtain other documents and records that may be relevant for a
20 just determination of the complaint;

21 (v) Review policies and policing codes of ethics that are relevant to
22 the nature of the complaint;

23 (vi) Seek forensic analysis where the nature of the case requires;
24 and

25 (vii) Take all other lawful steps to ensure a fair investigation and
26 just outcome for all the parties involved in the complaint.

27 5. A complainant who reasonably believes that their complaint has
28 not been properly handled by a State Office, or is otherwise dissatisfied with
29 the conduct of the investigation by a State Office, may write to the Secretary
30 of the Commission requesting that the complaint be reassigned.

1 6. Subject to section 8 of this Act, the Commission may investigate a
2 complaint through:

3 (i) The State Offices;

4 (ii) Investigative Committees;

5 (iii) Or any other means that the Commission may from time to time
6 prescribe or recommend.

7 7.-(1) Investigations into complaints made against police officers
8 shall be concluded within six (6) months of the original complaint and a final
9 report submitted to the Secretariat of the Police Service Commission for
10 action.

11 (2) Where exceptional circumstances cause an investigation to extend
12 beyond the six (6) month mark, the Investigative Officer shall submit a report
13 to the Secretariat of the Police Service Commission explaining why the
14 investigation has not been concluded and specifying the duration of time
15 required to conclude the investigation.

16 8. The Police Service Commission shall take all reasonable steps to
17 protect the identity of witnesses and protect them from retaliation,
18 victimisation or any risk arising from their witness testimony or other evidence
19 provided.

20 Upon the conclusion of an investigation into a complaint against a police
21 officer, the Coordinator of the State Office and the lead Investigator assigned to
22 the complaint, shall sign the report of the investigation, and submit same to:

23 (a) the Secretariat of the Police Service Commission; and

24 (b) the relevant police command where the indicted officer is
25 attached.

26 At the conclusion of investigation of a complaint by a State Office, an
27 independent Investigator or Monitor, a Committee or any other body saddled
28 with investigative responsibility by the Commission, the Commission shall
29 enter a verdict and issue a report detailing one, or a combination of the
30 following disciplinary actions:

- 1 (i) Further training of the officer involved for low-level matters of
2 misconduct;
- 3 (ii) Final written warning where the officer is not a first offender;
- 4 (iii) Temporary suspension without pay;
- 5 (iv) Reduction in Rank; and
- 6 (v) Dismissal from the Nigeria Police Force;

7 The decision of the Commission in respect of an Investigation Report by a
8 State Office, an independent Investigator or Monitor, a Committee or any
9 other body saddled with investigative responsibility by the Commission
10 shall be final.

11 (1) Where an investigation into a complaint against a police officer
12 determines prima facie that a crime may have been committed, the
13 Commission shall refer the case file and investigation report to the
14 appropriate prosecuting body.

15 (2) Depending on the nature of the offence, the appropriate
16 prosecuting body may include any of the following:
