PRESENTATION OF BILL

It gives me pleasure to forward the following Bill for consideration and enactment into Law :----

"A Bill for an Act to Prescribe the Basis for Distribution of Revenue Accruing to the Federation Account Between the Federal and State Governments and the Local Government Councils in the States ; the Formula for Distribution amongst the State *inter-se* ; the Proportion of the Total Revenue of Each State to be contributed to the State Joint Local Government Account, and for other purposes connected therewith".

2. You will recall that I appointed a Commission to review the revenue allocation system in the country and make recommendations in the light of the present constitutional framework. The Commission's report and our views thereon as reflected in a White Paper have already been laid before the National Assembly. This Bill now seeks to translate the recommendations in the White Paper into Law.

(b) within the preceding 10 years, he has been removed as a Member of any of the bodies established by Section 140 of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria of 1979, or as the holder of any other office on the ground of misconduct.

"(2): Any person employed in the Public Service of the Federation or of a State shall not be disqualified for appointment as a Chairman or Member of the Commission : Provided that where such person has been duly appointed on full-time basis, he shall, on his appointment, be deemed to have resigned or retired from his former office as from the date of his appointment.

"Clause 4 (I): The Chairman and any Member of the Commssion shall be removed from that office by the President acting upon an address supported by two-thirds majority of the Senate praying that he be so removed for inability to discharge the functions of the office (whether arising from infirmity of mind or body or any other cause) or for misconduct.

"Clause 4 (2) : In exercising his powers to make appointments or to exercise disciplinary control over persons, the Commission shall not be subject to the direction or control of any other authority or persons.

"Clause 4 (3): Upon the coming into force of this law, or upon the expiration of the life of the Commission at any time or upon a vacancy occurring in the Membership of the Commission, the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria shall send the appropriate nominations to the Senate within 30 days of being requested so to do by the President of the Senate ".

(b) A Member's Bill is a Bill initiated by a member or group of members of either House or both Houses of the National Assembly and introduced into the Senate as a legislative proposal of the member or group of members sponsoring the Bill.

(c) A Private Bill is any Bill other than an Executive Bill or a Member's Bill.

Bills affecting private rights

35. If it appears to the President from the notice of the terms proposed to be embodied in a bill originating in the Senate not being a Executive measure that the proposals are intended to affect or benefit some particular persons, association or corporate body then.

(1) Before allowing such a bill to be read the first time the President shall satisfy himself that, in addition to the notices already presented under Standing Order 39 (Notice regarding Bills), additional notice of the bill has been given by advertising a statement of its general nature and objects in the Official Gazette and in one newspaper circulating in Nigeria.

(2) When any such bill has been read a second time it shall stand referred to a select committee without question put. Any party whose interests are in the President's opinion prejudicially affected by the proposed provisions of the bill may be heard before the committee either in person or by Counsel.

(3) Every select committee on such a bill shall require proof of the facts and other allegation set forth in the bill as showing that it is expedient that the bill should be passed, and may take such oral or other evidence as it may think requisite, and thereafter if the committee find that the said facts and allegations are not proved, it shall report accordingly; but if the committee find that the said facts and allegations have been proved, the committee shall consider the several clauses of the bill, and may strike out clauses, add new clauses, and make any other amendments which it shall deem necessary, and in respect of all amendments which it makes shall describe their purport in a special report to the Senate. Now new clause shall be allowed in such a bill which is outside the terms of the noice in the Official Gazette.

(4) When it is intended to examine any witnesses, the petitioner or Senator requiring such witnesses shall deleiver to the Clerk two days at least before the day appointed for their examination, a list containing the name, residence and occupation of every witness.

(5) The evidence of every witness shall be taken down and when printed sent in proof to the witness. The witness shall be at liberty to suggest corrections due to inaccurate reporting and the evidence shall be printed with such of the corrections as may be approved by the Chairman.

(6) The committee may at its discretion refuse to hear any irrelevant or recalcitrant witness.

(7) After the report of the select committee has been presented to the Senate, the President

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

OVERSEAS VISIT BY MEMBERS OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

My officers and I feel very much gratified by some of the reports made about our Missions by members of the National Assembly undertaking visits abroad. These observations have helped towards the solution of some of the constraints under which Nigerian Missions abroad have been operating.

2. Our normal duty to assist and facilitate the visits of Honourable Members to foreign countries has now been stimulated to the level of interest that we feel we should draw your attention to certain factors which will enable us to maintain this standard. One of these is that, with the growing leading role Nigeria is playing in international affairs, foreign countries and their functionaries will increasingly wish to woo the Honourable Members of our National Assembly through invitations to visit their respective countries. In this Ministry, we have Departments which have expert knowledge of foreign countries and their political outlook, which we feel should be availed to the Honourable Members undertaking such trips, in their own interest and that of Nigeria. I would, therefore, appreciate your cooperation in seeking the advice of my Ministry whenever such occasions arise. Such reference to us will further enable our Missions abroad to prepare adequately to receive the visitors and arrange activities for them in a befitting manner.

3. On the part of the receiving countries, we have of recent, received complaints through our Missions, of visiting Members not participating in programmes arranged for them, or even cancelling to visit certain cities in which programmes have been arranged for them, without due notice. Where the receiving countries had been enthusiastic to cultivate goodwill among Nigerians, such omissions have been most embarrassing to the host authorities and to our officers who work among them.

4. It is therefore my earnest desire that the foregoing would be seen in the spirit of cooperation which my Ministry is endeavouring to foster with the National Assembly. If these views are acceptable to you, I would be grateful if they can be brought to the attention of all the Honourable Members of the National Assembly.

TELEGRAM FROM PRESIDENT-ELECT REAGAN TO AAI CONFERENCE, FREETOWN SIERRA LEONE.

1. It gives me great pleasure to greet the 11th African-American Dialogue Conference in Sierra Leone, and to wish the participants all success in their deliberations.

2. My Administration enters office with confidence about the future of America's Role in the world and with commitment to working closely with our friends and partners in other regions, including Africa. The world today is faced with mounting challenges to the independence, freedom, security and well-being of men and nations. Africa shares in these dilemmas.

3. The challenges of the 1980's require that Africans and Americans maintain a candid dialogue and a shared appreciation of our many mutual interests. We can neither afford to neglect each other nor to take each other for granted.

4. American's historical and cultural links with Africa as a result of the African heritage of Black Americans are today reinforced by an unprecedented two-way flow of people, goods and ideas between our two continents. We believe it is important to strengthen our African ties, and we recognize that in advancing this mutual interest, American investment, trade, economic assistance and security related support can play an important role.

5. It is my hope that your dialogue is symbolic of a constructive and fruitful relationship between our peoples and continents in the years ahead.

Esteemed Your Excellency Mr President,

I present my high compliments to you and have the honour to convey the part regarding the question of Korea's reunification, the vital question of our people, from the report made by Comrade KIM IL SUNG, General Secretary of the Central Committee of the Workers' Party of Korea and President of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea at the 6th Congress of our Party.

In his historic report, the respected and beloved Leader Comrade KIM IL SUNG, comprehensively analysed the internal and external situation relating to the question of Korea's reunification and, on that basis, advanced the plan for the establishment of a Democratic Confederal Republic of Koryo as a decisive step to hasten the reunification of Korea as soon as possible and the new programme for reunification clarifying its ten-point policy.

Illumined in detail in newly clarified programme for reunification are the basic principles of the Government of the Democratic Confederal Republic of Koryo, its function and role, its internal and external policies, and the principled matters to be solved at present for the realization of the reunification of Korea.

In South Korea where foreign troops station, fascist dictatorship reigns, human rights are ruthlessly trampled underfoot and the people are deprived of sacred rights of choosing their own destinies by themselves.

This is unpardonable infringement upon democracy.

The only way of removing tension and guaranteeing the durable peace on the Korean peninsula is to establish the Democratic Confederal Republic of Koryo transcending differences in ideology and system existing in reality in the north and the south while replacing the unstable Armistice Agreement with a peace treaty and putting an end to all kinds of outside interferences in the Korean question.

If the Democratic Confederal Republic of Koryo is established, national reconciliation and unity will be realized, root cause of armed conflict removed and solid and permanent peace brought to the Korean peninsula.

It will make a great contribution to removing tension in Asia and securing the world peace and security as well.

Expressing my conviction that you will pay attention to the new programme for reunification of our Party and the Government of our Republic and render your support and sympathy to it, I sincerely wish you good health as well as greater successes in your responsible work.

Please accept the renewed assurances of my high consideration.

(1) The constant search for a peaceful solution to the conflict above-mentioned on the one hand (which cannot be achieved without the assistance of peace and justice loving forces who should have full knowledge of facts) and, on the other hand,

PERSONS ELIGIBLE TO HOLD DIPLOMATIC PASSPORTS

As you may already be aware, Mr President has exercised his prerogative in approving that diplomatic passports should be issued to the following members of the National Assembly subject to the

National Assembly signifying agreement that the issuance of diplomatic passports should be so limited :

(i) Political Party Leaders in the National Assembly ;





I wish to acknowledge receipt of your Memorandum of today, 18th May 1981, concerning a "Sunday Punch" news item of 17th May, 1981, about a Senator from Kano State who allegedly mis-used funds meant for the payment of salaries to his legislative aides and to comment as follows :---

(1) That it is true that when my committee interviewed some Legislative Aides on Thursday 7th May, 1981, one Mallam Waisu A. Hameed who was purported to be Legislative Aide for Senator Danbatta denied having received any salaries as Legislative Aide whereas the Senator concerned had

claimed salaries in respect of Mallam Waisu A. Hameed with effect from December 1980 and had presented to the Committee payment vouchers purported to have been signed by all his staff including Mallam A. Hameed.

(2) That amongst the persons we interviewed as Legislative Aides for Senator Danbatta was a pregnant woman by name Umma Rabiu on salary scale G.L. 08. It is only from the newspaper report that we came to know that the pregnant woman was in-fact the wife of Senator Danbatta. We, therefore, intend to re-invite all the Legislative Aides attached to Senator Danbatta in the light of the present revelations. We will inform you of any other findings in due course.



It gives me great pleasure to forward the following Bills for consideration by the National Assembly and subsequent enactment into laws :

(i) Poll Tax (Abolition) Bill 1981

(ii) Nigerian Shippers Council (Amendment) Bill 1981

(iii) Nigerian Airports Authority (Amendment) Bill

(iv) Nigerian Civil Aviation Training Centre (Amendment) Bill 1981

(v) Agricultural Credit Scheme Guarantee Fund (Amendment) Bill 1981.

2. The Poll Tax (Abolition) Bill 1981 seeks to abolish the imposition of poll or community tax and cattle tax including tax imposed on any other form of livestock throughout the Federal Republic of Nigeria. Bills (*ii*) to (*iv*) above seek to reconstitute Membership of the Governing Boards of the various organisations while Bill (v) seeks to amend the Agricultural Credit Guarantee Scheme Fund Act 1977.

AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

It is made up of the Chief Justice of Nigeria in his capacity as the Chairman of the Federal Judicial Service Commission, the President of the Federal Court of Appeal, the Chief Judge of the Federal High Court, and all the nineteen Chief Judges of the State High Courts in their capacities as Chairmen of their State Judicial Service Commissions. The Hon. the Grand Kadi of Sokoto State Sharia Court of Appeal is also a member, representing all the Grand Kadis in the country.

2. The Committee, which is purely consultative, sits in Lagos four times a year. It discusses matters of common interest to the entire judiciary of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. It exchanges views on ways and means of improving the administration of justice generally. But, as I have said earlier, it is purely and simply a consultative body.

3. At some of its meetings, necessary amendments to the 1979 Constitution were discussed. As a result of these discussions, the draft amendments which I now forward herewith for due consideration by the National Assembly, were agreed.

4. The yellow sheets (six sets) contain the recommended amendments while the blue sheets (six sets) show how the amended sections would read when the amendments have been incorporated.

5. I should be grateful if you would cause all these amendments to be incorporated in the various amendments to the Constitution which are now being formulated by the National Assembly.





SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO LOOK INTO THE FACILITIES PROVIDED FOR THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY COMPLEX IN ABUJA ON 4TH SEPTEMBER, 1981

Following a resolution of the Senate of 13th July, 1981, the Special Committee looking into the facilities provided for the National Assembly Complex in Abuja undertook a one-day working tour of Abuja on 4th September, 1981. The delegation led by the President of the Senate, Dr Joseph Wayas consisted of the Leader of the Senate, Dr Sola Saraki, Senators Iliya Audu, C. O. Ilori, Garba Matta, Alhaji Tanko Yankassi, the Presidential Adviser on National Assembly Liaison ; the Clerk to the National Assembly, Alhaji Gidado Idris, the Clerk of the Senate, Mr A. A. Coker, Director of Protocol, Mr T. A. O. Otunla and other officials.

2. The delagation arrived at Suleja around 12 noon and drove straight to the Presidential Guest House under construction. The Guest House was being built to accommodate the President of the Federation pending the construction of his Official building. The Engineer on site explained to the delegation the design of the Presidential Guest House which consisted of three floors with underground floors. The upper floors were designed to incorporate the Kitchen, Banquet Hall, Offices and Dining area, respectively.

3. On conclusion of the inspection of the Presidential Guest House, the Engineer on site displayed the map of the Federal Capital Territory showing the locations of Phase 1 made up of 5 districts including the Central Area District, High-class residential area to house the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and other senior members of the National Assembly, Ministers, Ambassadors and top Government officials ; Accelerated District Centre Programme (residential area for officials) ; the three arms complex—the Presidency, National Assembly and the Supreme Court, the Secretariat complex, the ceremonial arcade and the shopping centre. Members of the delegation doubted the propriety of foreign envoys living in the midst of senior members of the Federal Government. However, the Minister for Federal Capital Development explained that the idea was only a suggestion and that the reactions of the National Assembly and the Ministry of External Affairs on the matter were being awaited.

4. On inquiry about residential accommodation for Senators and Members of the House of Representatives, the Engineer explained that Senators would be housed in single unit duplexes each of 4-5 bedrooms with boys quarters while members of the House of Representatives would be housed in flats. Regarding the National Assembly complex, it was revealed that as the building would not be ready before October 1982, arrangements had been concluded for the Conference Centre and part of the Shereton Hotel, to be converted for use whenever there was going to be a Joint Session of the National Assembly. The President of the Senate expressed his dissatisfaction with the arrangement in view of its temporary nature and the extra costs that would be involved in modifying the Conference Centre. The Minister however explained that there was no extra cost in respect of the modification. Nevertheless, officials of the National Assembly informed the Consultant that the Conference Centre with 28 Committee Rooms and 28 office rooms were far too small for the requirements of the National Assembly. The Consultant agreed and suggested that office blocks could be erected on the grounds of the Conference Centre to provide additional office spaces. At this juncture the President of the Senate declared that it would be better for the Abuja authorities to concentrate on building the

permanent structure for the National Assembly as a matter of urgency. At the end of the briefing, the delegation drove round the Accelerated District Centre where some residential Quarters had been completed and saw others nearing completion before driving back to the field Base at Suleja.

5. The delegation next visited the Minister's office and saw displayed a module of the National Assembly complex. The Japanese Consultants who designed the module explained the different components that made up the buildings which had provision for—

(i) A Senate Chamber with a sitting capacity for 150 members and galleries ;

(ii) House of Representatives Chamber with a sitting capacity for 600 members and galleries;

(iii) Joint Session Chamber with a sitting capacity for 1,500 members and galleries ;

(iv) Offices for Senators, Members of the House of Representatives and Officials ;

(v) A block to house the Code of Conduct Bureau and the Auditor-General of the Federation ;

(vi) A National Mosque and a National Cathedral.

The President of the Senate commended the designers for the work done and pointed out that the Code of Conduct Bureau was a different organisation from the Auditor-General of the Federation and as such should be housed separately. He also noted that Nigeria was a secular State and there was no reason for the provision of religious buildings on the premises of the National Assembly. The religious buildings were therefore ordered to be excised from the National Assembly complex. Furthermore, he emphasised that the staff buildings of the National Assembly should be situated near the National Assembly itself. Moreover, the staff buildings should not be constructed on owner occupier basis but made available to all members of the staff who work for the National Assembly irrespective of whether they intend to purchase the houses they live in. Thereafter, he directed the Consultant to come down to Lagos and explain to the appropriate Committees of the National Assembly their designs for the National Assembly at Abuja.

6. Before leaving Suleja for Lagos the delegation paid a courtesy call on the Emir of Suleja. In his welcome Address, the Emir prayed the President of the Senate to use his good offices to ensure that a Federal School of Arts and Science earmarked for Suleja town was established in Suleja and that compensation was paid to the farmers who were disposed of their land for the erection of the institution. The President, in his reply, commended the Emir for his sacrifice and promised to convey the Emir's request to the appropriate quarters.

7. The delegation left Suleja by 5 p.m.

8. Observation :

That the delegation was not able to inspect the National Assembly complex as the site was inaccessible.

9. Recommendations :

(i) That the Federal Capital Authority should as a matter of urgency proceed with construction work on the National Assembly Complex instead of modifying the Conference Centre and the Shereton Hotel for temporary use of the National Assembly.

(ii) That the buildings earmarked in the National Assembly Complex as the National Mosque and the National Cathedral be removed as part of the National Assembly Complex.

(*iii*) That the offices of the Code of Conduct Bureau and the Auditor-General of the Federation should be in separate buildings and not in the same building as provided for in the present design of the National Assembly.

(iv) That the National Assembly staff buildings should be built near the National Assembly Complex and that these buildings should not be built on owner-occupier basis to ensure mobility of staff for the National Assembly.

(v) That the Consultants and Architects responsible for the National Assembly Complex should be invited to explain to the appropriate Committees of the National Assembly their designs for the National Assembly at Abuja, after incorporating the above recommendations.

(vi) That the office suites designed for Senators are totally unacceptable and should be redesigned in consultation with and with the approval of this Committee.

(vii) That this Committee as a result of its visit to Abuja is of the considered opinion that the temporary facilities will not be ready by 1982 and in view of Nigeria's intention to build a model capital city befitting the status of the Nation, Mr President of the Federal Republic be advised to reschedule a realistic date for moving the capital to Abuja.
